


Shrimp Scampi with Fettuccine Alfredo

Shrimp Scampi

Ingredients

30 medium shrimp - peeled and deveined	2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons butter, melted	2 cloves garlic, minced
½ teaspoon kosher salt	¼ teaspoon ground black pepper

Directions;

- 1) Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2) Toss the shrimp in a bowl with the olive oil, melted butter, garlic, salt, and pepper; set aside for 10 minutes. Arrange the shrimp in a circular pattern in a round casserole dish.
- 3) Bake in the preheated oven until the shrimp are pink and cooked through, about 15 minutes.

Fettuccine Alfredo

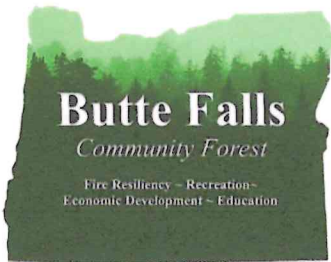
Ingredients

24 ounces dry fettuccine pasta	1 cup butter
¾ pint heavy cream	salt and pepper to taste
1 dash garlic salt	¾ cup grated Romano cheese
½ cup grated Parmesan cheese	

Directions

- 1) Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add fettuccine and cook for 8 to 10 minutes or until al dente; drain.
- 2) Melt butter into cream in a large saucepan over low heat; add salt, pepper, and garlic salt. Increase the heat to medium; stir in grated Romano and Parmesan cheese until melted and sauce has thickened.
- 3) Add cooked pasta to sauce & shrimp and toss until thoroughly coated; serve immediately.

Serve with green salad and garlic bread.

Butte Falls Community Forest Commission Meeting Minutes

January 3, 2024, 6:00 pm School Admin Room

Attendees: Janice Schultz (Chair), Sonya Goddess (Liaison) on Zoom, Commissioners: Mike Smeltz, Linda Spencer, Ben Decarlow, Don Hamann, Nate Bailey

Meeting Minutes: Meeting was documented on Zoom and transcribed by Janice. No notes from the last meeting to approve.

Public Comments: No public audience

- Linda Spencer officially resigned as the commissioner of Economic Development. Trish is picking up the meetings for now. Janice will send out a reminder of the Forest Chats for now. Two of Linda's duties.
- Nate introduced Josh Browning. He will be the Archery Committee Lead. Josh is going to work with Nate and help us get our archery project up and started. The project will fall under Recreation, so Janice will be the Commissioner for that.

There was a motion at the meeting that this project should fall under Special Projects, and that Josh should be the commissioner. But looking at Ordinance 342.1, shows that we removed that position because of the need for a quorum. The more commissioners' spots that are empty the less likely for a quorum. Special projects would be empty much of the time, so we decided to place any special projects under the appropriate commissioner. We will need to erase the motion for Special Projects Commissioner. The project will be under the Recreation Commissioner, but with Nate being out in front of it and Josh being the committee lead. Josh will meet with Nate and I to discuss his plans. He will oversee the people that come together to work on this project. We'll talk more about it at the next meeting. Ordinance 342.1 has been approved by the City Council, so any changes will send it that way again. I'm sorry I didn't have the ordinance with me for reference.

Action Items: Archery Project:

1. Nate will investigate new insurance and run it by Katie.
 - Who is the best provider for this type of project?
 - Liability is important.
2. Josh will form the group and we will put it in the Butte Falls Bulletin in February that people are needed to help; hoping to get some local folks interested.
3. We need to get those trailers out of there.
4. Store items in a metal storage container?
5. Local folks will get discounts.
6. Look for grants.

Ben: The NRC is going to host a fire safety class and Ben wants to know if March 23rd or April 6th is better for the commissioners. Everybody felt that at this point either date is fine. He will let us know. We will invite Nancy from the Ford Foundation and others. We need to do some big publicity for this event.

Discussion: We talked a bit about people storing items on BFCF land.

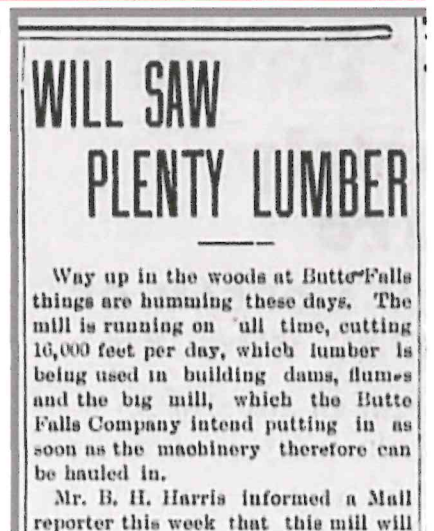


HYMNS HOUR
